

2026 ANGUS FOUNDATION VOCATIONAL TECHNICAL/TRADE SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES AND APPLICATION

The Angus Foundation will award scholarships to young men and women actively involved in the Angus breed who are attending vocational technical/trade school or equivalent. No equivalent work will be required from the scholarship recipients. Winners will be announced in conjunction with the upcoming National Junior Angus Show.

Once a qualified applicant's application has been determined complete and eligible for review, it will be considered by the Angus Foundation's Scholarship Selection Committee comprised of two Angus Foundation representatives, two Angus industry representatives and one National Junior Angus Association (NJAA) representative.

All applications must be submitted by email to scholarships@angus.org.

Applicant Qualifications

1. Applicants must have at one time been a National Junior Angus Association member and must currently be an active Junior, Regular or Life member of the American Angus Association.
2. The applicant must be a graduating high school senior or must be enrolled in an accredited institution (vocational technical/trade school or equivalent) for the fall term in which the scholarship is to be awarded. Applicants must have a minimum 2.0 GPA (accumulative) on a 4.0 scale to be eligible.
3. The applicant cannot have reached their 25th birthday prior to January 1 of the year of application.
4. The scholarship must be applied to undergraduate studies.
5. If selected to receive a scholarship by the Angus Foundation Scholarship Selection Committee, the scholarship applicant will be required to verify their enrollment in an institution of higher education by September 15 before the scholarship award check can be issued. Failure to meet enrollment requirements may result in forfeiture of the scholarship.
6. Should the recipient fail to complete at least one semester of full-time enrollment in an accredited or approved institution of higher education prior to June 30, 2027, for any reason, scholarship funds must be refunded to the Angus Foundation.
7. Applicants can only receive Angus Foundation Vocational Technical/Trade School Scholarship once.

Instructions for Completing Application

The application may be reproduced on your computer, but the same allotted space must be given to each of the items and questions in the application. Font must be Times New Roman size 11 – 12 point. **APPLICATION MUST NOT EXCEED FIVE (5) PAGES IN LENGTH.**

Your application MUST include a copy of your most current high school or college/university transcript. High school transcripts will only be accepted for incoming freshman. All continuing students will need to send a copy of their most current college/university transcript. **The transcript(s) MUST be included with the scholarship application when emailed to the Angus Foundation. Transcripts sent separate from the scholarship application will not be accepted.**

Your application MUST include two letters of recommendation. Recommendations may come from employers, teachers, ag leaders, extension agents, veterinarians, pastors, etc. They may NOT include applicants, parents, American Angus Association board of directors or American Angus Association employees and/or related entities. Individuals writing recommendation letters should include a candid evaluation of the applicant's abilities, background, character, strengths, weaknesses, etc. **Both letters of recommendation MUST be included with the application when it is emailed to the Angus Foundation @ scholarships@angus.org. Letters of recommendation sent separate from the scholarship application will not be accepted.**

May 1, 2026, is the absolute deadline for submitting applications. NOTE: With regard to this deadline, materials emailed must be received on or before May 1. Applicant should consider an email reply with confirmation as completion of submission. The Angus Foundation is not responsible for applications with no confirmation reply sent.

IMPORTANT FINAL REMINDER: For a scholarship application to be considered complete and eligible for review by the Angus Foundation Scholarship Selection Committee, the application MUST:

- 1) Use 2026 application.
- 2) Include member code of the applicant.
- 3) Be submitted by May 1 of the application year.
- 4) Include two letters of recommendation (see restrictions above).
- 5) Include copy of most current transcript.
- 6) Email completed application and ALL attachments to scholarships@angus.org.
- 7) Receive emailed confirmation your application was received by Angus Foundation Staff.

Additional Scholarship Opportunities: Applicants are encouraged to apply for the Jim Baldridge Outstanding Leadership Award and/or the Angus Foundation Undergraduate Scholarship (see separate applications). Applicants for this scholarship are ineligible from applying for the Commercial Cattlemen Scholarship.
