

John Grimes Memorial Scholarship – Premier Junior Exhibitor Phenotype and Genotype Show

John Grimes was one of the creators behind the creation of the Phenotype and Genotype Show after recognizing the gap between the show ring and real-world beef production. The basis behind the Phenotype and Genotype Show (PGS) is to select cattle on both their genetics and their phenotype, as a commercial cattlemen would do at a bull sale when evaluating their next herd sire or a purebred cattleman selecting their next female.

In memory of John, the Grand Champion Owned PGS Female and the Grand Champion Bred and Owned PGS Female will each receive a traveling trophy. In addition, the John Grimes Memorial Scholarship will be presented to an exhibitor of the Phenotype and Genotype Show at the National Junior Angus Show.

Qualifications of the John Grimes Memorial Scholarship awarded to the Premier Junior Exhibitor of the National Junior Angus Show Phenotype and Genotype Show:

- The premier exhibitor of an Angus junior show is the exhibitor who exhibits the highest placing animals throughout the Phenotype and Genotype Show including females and bulls (owned and bred and owned). A maximum of five head per exhibitor will be counted toward the calculation of the Premier PGS Exhibitor award.
- Points will be awarded to each animal exhibited by the junior member. Points will be awarded for each entry as follows:

<u>Class Winners</u> 1 st – 5 points 2 nd – 4 points 3 rd – 3 points 4 th – 2 points 5 th – 1 point	<u>Bred and Owned Class Winners</u> 1 st – 3 points 2 nd – 2 points 3 rd – 1 point
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Points will be awarded based on the composite score.

- Division Champions/Reserve Divisions and Grand/Reserve overall are not included in these points and will only be used in the case of a tie.
- Overall Grand/Reserve Champions will always take precedence over division champions, regardless of the number of division/reserve division champions another exhibitor has.

Example:

In this example, Exhibitor A and C both earned 16 points. Both had two head that placed first in their class and were bred and owned. Remember, Division Champions/Reserve Divisions and Grand/Reserve Champions are not included in the point count, unless there is a tie. Exhibitor A would be named champion because of the grand champion bred and owned female.
