## AMERICAN ANGUS ASSOCIATION® STANDARD CLASSIFICATIONS FOR JUNIOR ANGUS STEER SHOWS

Any classes listed in this classification, which exceeds 15 head per class, should be broken into smaller classes. This should be accomplished by dividing the class as evenly as possible without splitting animals with the same birth date.

Furthermore, the recommended number of head per class varies per show based on number of head checked in. See recommendations below:

- -Shows with less than 100 head: 8 head or less per class
- -Shows with 100 200 head: 12 head or less per class
- -Shows with more than 200 head: 15 head or less per class.

Class breaks will be at the discretion of the American Angus Association staff in attendance.

If there are more than 30 head in a division, the division should be split into Division 1, 2, etc.

## THIS CLASSIFICATION IS EFFECTIVE FOR SHOWS FROM JUNE 1, 2026 TO DECEMBER 31, 2026

Only registered Angus cattle that meet the age requirements listed within this classification are eligible to receive premium participation and be counted in the total number of head shown. Champion and Reserve Champion placings are not counted in number of head shown.

- 1. Late senior steers calved November & December, 2025
- 2. Early senior steers calved September & October, 2025
- 3. Late summer yearling steers calved July & August, 2025
- 4 Early summer yearling steers calved May & June, 2025
- 5. April junior yearling steers calved April, 2025
- 6. March junior yearling steers calved March, 2025
- 7. Early junior yearling steers calved January & February, 2025
