2025 ANGUS FOUNDATION COMMERCIAL CATTLEMEN SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES AND APPLICATION

January 1, 2025

The Angus Foundation is extending their scholarship program to young men and women utilizing registered Angus genetics in their commercial cattle operation. These youth and/or their parents/guardians must use registered Angus genetics in their commercial breeding program. Youth eligible are pursuing an undergraduate degree in animal science, agriculture, rangeland management or a technical trade, and are seeking financial support for the cost of their education at a university, community college or trade school. Scholarships consist of multiple \$1,500 scholarships. Winners will be notified in July. Students from an Angus seedstock background are NOT eligible, only commercial.

Once a qualified applicant's application has been determined complete and eligible for review, it will be considered by the Angus Foundation's Scholarship Selection Committee comprised of two Angus Foundation representatives, two Angus industry representatives and one beef cattle industry leader. Emphasis will be placed on an applicant's knowledge of the cattle industry and their perspective of how to best utilize Angus genetics in a commercial operation.

Applicant Qualifications

- 1. Applicant or applicant's parents/guardians must have transferred or been transferred an Angus registration paper in the last 36 months (On or after May 1, 2022).
- 2. The applicant must be a graduating high school senior or must be enrolled in a junior college, four-year college/university or other accredited institution of higher education, such as a trade school, for the fall term in which the scholarship is to be awarded. Applicants must have a minimum 2.0 GPA (accumulative) to be eligible.
- 3. The applicant cannot have reached their 25th birthday prior to January 1 of the year of application.
- 4. The scholarship must be applied to undergraduate studies and is applicable to animal science, vocational programs (such as welding or diesel mechanics), rangeland management, agriculture or closely related fields of study.
- 5. If selected to receive a scholarship by the Angus Foundation Scholarship Selection Committee, the scholarship applicant will be required to verify their enrollment in an institution of higher education by/before September 15 before the scholarship award check can be issued. Failure to meet enrollment requirements may result in forfeiture of the scholarship.
- 6. Should the recipient fail to complete at least one semester of full-time enrollment in an accredited or approved institution of higher education prior to June 30, 2026, for any reason, scholarship funds **must** be refunded to the Angus Foundation.
- 7. Applicants having received or applied for Angus Foundation undergraduate scholarships using our standard general application this year or in past years, will NOT be considered for this scholarship. Program is <u>not</u> for seedstock youth.
- 8. Applicants can only receive Angus Foundation Commercial Cattlemen Scholarship once. (Formally known as the Allied Angus Breeders Scholarship.)

Instructions for Completing Application

The application may be reproduced on your computer, but the same allotted space must be given to each of the items and questions in the application. Font must be Times New Roman size 11 - 12 point. **APPLICATION MUST NOT EXCEED FIVE (5) PAGES IN LENGTH.**

Your application MUST include a copy of your most current high school or college/university transcript. High school transcripts will only be accepted for incoming freshman. All continuing students will need to send a copy of their most current college/university transcript. The transcript MUST be included with the scholarship application when emailed to the Angus Foundation. Transcripts sent separate from the scholarship application will not be accepted.

May 1, 2024, is the absolute deadline for submitting applications. NOTE: With regard to this deadline, materials emailed must be received on or before May 1. Applicant should consider an email reply with confirmation as completion of submission. The Angus Foundation is not responsible for applications with no confirmation reply sent.

IMPORTANT FINAL REMINDER: For a scholarship application to be considered *complete and eligible* for review by the Angus Foundation Scholarship Selection Committee, the application MUST:

- 2) _____Include member code of the applicant.
- 3) _____Be submitted by May 1 of the application year.
- 4) _____Include copy of most current transcript.
- 5) ____Email completed application and ALL attachments to scholarships@angus.org.
- 6) _____Receive emailed confirmation your application was received by Angus Foundation Staff.
